1 ORDINANCE NO.: 2025-2 ORDINANCE RELATING TO PUBLICATION OF LEGAL ADVERTISEMENTS 3 AND NOTICES; PROVIDING FOR THE INCORPORATION OF RECITALS; CREATING HERNANDO COUNTY CODE SECTION 1-12; PROVIDING FOR 4 5 PUBLICATION OF LEGALLY REQUIRED ADVERTISEMENTS AND NOTICES ON A PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE WEBSITE OF THE COUNTY, AS 6 7 PERMITTED BY FLA. STAT. § 50.0311; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE, PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL 8 9 OF CONFLICTING POSITIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE 10 DATE. 11 WHEREAS, Fla. Stat. § 50.011 provides requirements relating to the publication of legal 12 notices, including requirements relating to the types of newspapers and print publications that may be utilized for official legal advertisements and notices placed by local governments; and, 13 14 WHEREAS, Fla. Stat. § 50.011 also provides that such advertisements and notices may 15 instead be placed on a publicly accessible website, as provided in Fla. Stat. § 50.0311; and, 16 WHEREAS, Fla. Stat. § 50.0311 in turn provides that "[a] governmental agency may use the 17 publicly accessible website of the county in which it lies to publish legally required advertisements 18 and public notices if the cost of publishing advertisements and public notices on such website is less 19 than the cost of publishing advertisements and public notices in a newspaper"; and,

WHEREAS, Fla. Stat. § 50.0311 further provides that, if a governmental agency utilizes a publicly accessible County website to provide required advertisements and notices, a link to such advertisements and notices shall be conspicuously placed "[o]n the website's homepage or on a page accessible through a direct link from the homepage" and "[o]n the homepage of the website of each governmental agency publishing notices on the publicly accessible website or on a page accessible through a direct link from the homepage"; and,

WHEREAS, in addition, the statute requires any governmental agency using a publicly accessible County website to publish advertisements and notices to also "provide notice at least once per year in a newspaper of general circulation or another publication that is mailed or delivered to all residents and property owners throughout the government"s jurisdiction, indicating that property owners and residents may receive legally required advertisements and public notices from the governmental agency by first-class mail or e-mail upon registering their name and address or e-mail address with the governmental agency," and to "maintain a registry of names, addresses, and e-mail addresses of property owners and residents who have requested in writing that they receive legally required advertisements and public notices from the governmental agency by first-class mail or e-mail"; and,

WHEREAS, this Board finds that to the extent the cost of publishing advertisements and public notices on a County-designated publicly accessible website is less than the cost of publishing advertisements and public notices in a newspaper, it is in the best interest of the County to maintain a County website in accordance with Fla. Stat. § 50.0311, so that the County, and possibly other

1	governmental agencies located within the County, may utilize the website to provide legal
2	advertisements and notices; and,
3	WHEREAS, however, the County Code contains requirements that various legal
4	advertisements and notices be placed in a newspaper of general circulation or similar print
5	publication; and
6	WHEREAS, these requirements to advertise or provide notice in a newspaper are ubiquitous
7	throughout the County Code, appearing in innumerable chapters and sections; and,
8	WHEREAS, accordingly, this Board wishes to create a new provision in the County Code
9	to specifically address online publication of County legal advertisements and notices, and to provide
10	that such County advertisements and notices may be placed on a publicly accessible website of the
11	County, to the extent permitted by law;
12	NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY
13	COMMISSIONERS OF HERNANDO COUNTY, FLORIDA:
14	Section 1. Incorporation of Recitals. The foregoing recitals are approved and incorporated
15	herein.
16	Section 2. Publication of Notices on Publicly Available Website. A new Section 1-12 of
17	the Hernando County Code, to be entitled "Advertisement and Notice by Publication on Publicly
18	Accessible Website of the County," is hereby created to read as follows:
19	Advertisement and Notice by Publication on Publicly Accessible Website of the
20	County.

1 Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, wherever in this Code an (a) 2 advertisement or notice is required to be published by the County in a newspaper of general circulation or other print publication, such advertisement or notice may 3 instead be provided on a publicly accessible website, as permitted by Fla. Stat. Ch. 4 5 50, provided that: 6 (1) The cost of providing advertisements and public notices on such website is less than the cost of publishing advertisements and public notices in a 7 8 newspaper; and, 9 (2) Publication on such website conforms with the requirements of Fla. 10 Stat. § 50.0311; and, 11 (3) Publication on such website is made within the time frame required 12 by this Code for the respective advertisement or notice, and includes all information required by the respective Code provisions. 13 14 To the extent state or federal law imposes additional requirements relating (b) 15 to the publication of particular advertisements or notices, nothing in this section shall 16 be deemed to supersede or supplant such requirements. 17 **Section 3.** Severability. It is declared to be the intent of the Board of County Commissioners that if any section, subsection, clause, sentence, phrase, or provision of this 18 19 ordinance is for any reason held unconstitutional or invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect 20 the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

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1	Section 4. Inclusion in the Code. It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners						
2	of Hernando County, Florida, and it is hereby provided, that the provisions of this Ordinance shall						
3	become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of Hernando County, Florida. To this end						
4	the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intention, and						
5	that the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or any other appropriate						
6	designation.						
7	Section 5. Conflicting Provision	s Repealed	. All ordinances	or parts of ordinances	in		
8	conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.						
9	Section 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon receipt of						
10	official acknowledgment from the office of the Secretary of State of Florida that this ordinance has						
11	been filed with said office.
