There was Board consensus to direct the staff to prepare an Ordinance with Options 1 and 2 as presented, including Class A Subdivisions; to research options for an increase in the disposal assessment; and for the service level to be 2/1/1 with four bulk pickups of up to seven items each. These will be brought back for discussion at a future Board meeting.

#### **Discussion Regarding Trailer Usage at Solid Waste and Recycling Department West Convenience Center**

There was Board consensus to reduce trips to one trip per day, to eliminate Construction and Demolition debris and to limit furniture and yard waste trips to five trips per year at the Convenience Center.
