The Ordinance establishes a permitting fee for any fencing or wall over 7'. Therefore, any business that installs fencing and walls over this height could anticipate an increase of \$63.84 per installation.

b. New Charges/Fees on Businesses Impacted:

Any fence under 7' would be permitted by right and would not require a fence permit.

c. Estimate of Regulatory Costs:
