WHEREAS, mediation is a voluntary, confidential, and collaborative process that empowers families, neighbors, business, and community members to craft their own solutions to conflicts while preserving relationships and dignity; and

WHEREAS, county mediation strengthens the fabric of our neighborhoods by addressing disputes over property lines, noise complaints, homeowner association matters, and other quality-of-life issues before they escalate into costly legal battles.


SECTION 1. The Board of County Commissioners hereby proclaim October 12–18, 2025 as **MEDIATION WEEK** in Hernando County.






