I. <u>Proposed Ordinance Title/Reference</u>: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 23, ARTICLE III, DIVISIONS I-VI, OF THE HERNANDO COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES RELATING TO IMPACT FEES; SECTION 23-46 (FIRE/EMS), 23-91(PUBLIC CAPITAL FACILITIES-LAW ENFORCEMENT)-, 23-114 (PARKS), AND 23-69 (EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES), AND 23-138 (ROADS).

## III. Summary of Proposed Ordinance and Statement of Public Purpose to be Served:

The Legislature finds that impact fees are an important source of revenue for a local government to use in funding the infrastructure necessitated by new growth. Section 163.31801, F.S. This Ordinance provides a schedule of rates related to impact fees for Fire/EMS, Public Facilities, Parks and Educational facilities by using the most recent and localized data available.

There is a rational nexus between future growth, as measured by new construction, and the need to expand the Fire Rescue System, Public Facilities, Parks and Roads through the acquisition and construction of new Buildings, apparatus, equipment, and other Infrastructure to maintain the standards of service currently provided by the County and accommodate growth. This Ordinance serves a public purpose and the public health, safety, morals and welfare by managing growth and providing a means to provide the necessary public facilities and imposition of impact fees to fund the capital cost of facilities necessitated by such development, thereby requiring future growth to contribute its fair share of the costs necessary to fund required capital improvements and additions consistent with sound and generally accepted growth management, fiscal and public administration practices and principles.
