Attached hereto please find a draft sexual predator/offender regulatory ordinance. I believe that this draft includes the provisions from county codes of Brevard, Citrus, Collier, Hillsborough, and Pasco Counties, and the municipal code of the City of Jacksonville, that we discussed in our conference of October 26<sup>th</sup>.

Please note that in order to comply with *Doe v. City of Palm Bay*, 169 So. 3d 1211, 1219 (Fla. 5<sup>th</sup> DCA 2015), I eliminated any phrases that could be considered ambiguous (e.g., “any place that children may gather,” etc.).

Also, please note that the proposed ordinance cannot have the practical effect of banishing sexual offenders or predators from the County, as it would violate the Constitution’s prohibition on ex post facto laws. See *Stronger v. California*, 539 U.S. 607, 645 (2003). Thus, the proposed ordinance’s buffer can be greater than 1,000 feet, but if so, we will need to present evidence to the P & Z Commission and the BOCC that there will still be areas within Hernando County where these people can live.

Please review and advise.
