

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

In compliance with the provisions of Chapter 125 and Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, a public hearing will be held by the Hernando County Board of County Commissioners at 9:00 a.m., or shortly thereafter, on Tuesday, April 11, 2023, in the John Law Ayers County Commission Chambers, 20 North Main Street, Room 160, Brooksville, Florida 34601, to consider an Ordinance to grant a petition to establish the Caldera Community Development District. The title of the proposed Ordinance is as follows:

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE CALDERA COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 190, FLORIDA STATUTES; NAMING THE DISTRICT; DESCRIBING THE EXTERNAL BOUNDARIES OF THE DISTRICT; DESCRIBING THE FUNCTIONS AND POWERS OF THE DISTRICT; DESIGNATING FIVE PERSONS TO SERVE AS THE INITIAL MEMBERS OF THE DISTRICT'S BOARD OF SUPERVISORS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN ARTICLE II, CHAPTER 10.5, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF HERNANDO COUNTY, FLORIDA; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF CONFLICTING PROVISIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

The proposed Caldera Community Development District is comprised of approximately 253.679 acres, located in unincorporated Hernando County, west of Suncoast Parkway South, south of Robinhood Village, north of Powerline Road and east of Weeki Wachee Acres. The petitioner has proposed to establish the Caldera Community Development District to plan, finance, acquire, construct, operate and maintain all infrastructure and community facilities, which may be authorized by such districts under Florida law, including but not limited to water management and control, water supply, sewer, wastewater management, bridges or culverts, roads and street light, parks and recreational facilities, security facilities, and certain other projects when expressly approved or required by a local government and any other facilities in accordance with Section 190.012(1), (2)(a) and (d) and (3), Florida Statutes. The legal description of the proposed Caldera Community Development District is as follows:

DESCRIPTION: A PARCEL OF LAND LYING IN SECTION 16, TOWNSHIP 23 SOUTH, RANGE 18 EAST, HERNANDO COUNTY, FLORIDA, AND BEING MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS:

BEGINNING AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SAID SECTION 16, RUN THENCE ALONG THE WEST BOUNDARY OF SAID SECTION 16, N.00°04'55"E., A DISTANCE OF 2645.92 FEET; THENCE N.00°05'28"E., A DISTANCE OF 1378.68 FEET; THENCE LEAVING SAID WEST BOUNDARY OF SECTION 16, N.23°44'23"E., A DISTANCE OF 1395.29 FEET TO A POINT ON THE NORTH BOUNDARY OF SAID SECTION 16; RUN THENCE ALONG SAID NORTH BOUNDARY LINE OF SECTION 16, S.89°38'56"E., A DISTANCE OF 2083.07 FEET; THENCE LEAVING SAID NORTH BOUNDARY LINE OF SECTION 16, S.00°01'12"E., A DISTANCE OF 1324.75 FEET; THENCE S.89°45'47"E., A DISTANCE OF 661.42 FEET; THENCE S.00°00'45"E., A DISTANCE OF 1324.50 FEET; THENCE N.89°51'01"W., A DISTANCE OF 660.89 FEET TO A POINT BEING THE CENTER OF SAID SECTION 16; THENCE N.89°50'44"W., A DISTANCE OF 1324.16 FEET; THENCE S.00°01'17"W., A DISTANCE OF 2649.82 FEET TO A POINT ON THE SOUTH BOUNDARY OF SAID SECTION 16; RUN THENCE ALONG SAID SOUTH BOUNDARY OF SECTION 16, N.89°40'43"W., A DISTANCE OF 1326.88 FEET TO THE POINT OF BEGINNING.

All interested persons and affected units of general-purpose local government shall be given an opportunity to appear and be heard at the public hearing and present oral or written comments on the petition and ordinance. Any person or affected unit of general-purpose local government, who wishes to appeal any decision made by the Board with respect to any matter considered at this public hearing will need a record of the proceedings. For that purpose, the person or unit of general-purpose local government will need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceedings is made that includes the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based.
