

RESOLUTION NO. 2025 - _____

WHEREAS, Hernando County has adopted zoning regulations pursuant to Section 125.01(1) and Chapter 163, *Florida Statutes*, which authorize the County to regulate the use of land in the unincorporated areas of Hernando County, Florida, and take action on the request herein; and

WHEREAS, the Hernando County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) conducted a duly advertised public hearing to consider the requested changes in zoning on the specified parcels in Hernando County, Florida, as more fully described below;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF HERNANDO COUNTY, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

APPLICANT: Society Hill Capital Partners, LLC on behalf of Gold Dust Farms, a Florida General Partnership

FILE NUMBER: H-24-20

REQUEST: Rezoning from AG (Agricultural) to CPDP (Combined Planned Development) to include PDP(REC)/Planned Development Project (Recreation) and PDP(RR)/Planned Development Project (Resort Residential) with Deviations and Establish a (PSFOD) Public Service Facility Overlay District for the future construction of a fire station

GENERAL LOCATION: North side of Lake Lindsey Road, approximately 4,500' east of US Hwy 41

PARCEL KEY NUMBERS: 00337399, 00338423, 01355893

REQUEST: Rezoning from AG (Agricultural) to CPDP (Combined Planned Development) to include PDP(REC)/Planned Development Project (Recreation) and PDP(RR)/Planned Development Project (Resort Residential) with Deviations and Establish a (PSFOD) Public Service Facility Overlay District for the future construction of a fire station as enumerated in the BOCC Action, which is incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof. The representations contained in the rezoning application are incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof and are relied upon by the County to be true and correct. For purposes herein, it is presumed that all notice and advertising requirements have been satisfied.

FINDINGS OF FACT: ALL of the facts and conditions set forth in the County's staff memoranda and presented to the BOCC in connection with the public hearing in this matter are incorporated herein by reference and made a material part of this Resolution as integral to the BOCC's Action. The BOCC finds that the testimony and record supporting APPROVAL of the request to be credible and to constitute competent substantial evidence. In further support thereof, the BOCC makes the following specific findings of fact:

1. The proposed request is consistent with the County's adopted Comprehensive Plan and is compatible with the surrounding land uses.

**CONCLUSIONS
OF LAW:**

The BOCC is authorized to act on this matter pursuant to Chapters 125 and 163, *Florida Statutes*. Accordingly, after public hearing and testimony, being fully advised in the record, and based upon competent substantial evidence, the BOCC makes the following specific conclusions of law:

1. The proposed request is consistent with the County's adopted Comprehensive Plan and is compatible with the surrounding land uses.

ACTION:

After notice and public hearing, based upon the record in this matter and ALL of the findings of fact and conclusions of law above, the BOCC hereby APPROVES Rezoning from AG (Agricultural) to CPDP (Combined Planned Development) to include PDP(REC)/Planned Development Project (Recreation) and PDP(RR)/Planned Development Project (Resort Residential) with Deviations and Establish a (PSFOD) Public Service Facility Overlay District for the future construction of a fire station as set forth in the BOCC Action, which is incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof. Any requests, uses, variances or exceptions that were requested in connection with this rezoning application but not specifically approved herein are hereby deemed DENIED.
