#### I. Proposed Ordinance Title/Reference:

AN ORDINANCE OF HERNANDO COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING APPENDIX A (ZONING), ARTICLE IV, SECTION 11 (PSF PUBLIC SERVICE FACILITY OVERLAY DISTRICT), SUBSECTION 5, BY ALIGNING OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS WITH STATE REGULATORY AGENCIES; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

# III. Summary of Proposed Ordinance and Statement of Public Purpose to be Served:

The Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) is the primary regulatory authority for construction and demolition (C&D) debris landfills within the State of Florida. The Hernando County Zoning Appendix A, Article IV, Section 11 (PSF Public Service Facility Overlay District), Subsection 5 imposes additional local regulations and inspection requirements. The proposed amendment seeks to reduce these additional regulations and the economic impact on businesses by eliminating the requirement for financial assurance and regulatory fees. The amendment maintains critical oversight requirements for record keeping and compliance inspections to ensure compliance with FDEP and County standards.
