Legislative Issue FY 24/25 Public Safety Training Center

Funding Request: \$7,100,000 County Match: \$1,010,000

Background:

Continued education and training are vital to the services provided for public health and safety. Hernando County Public Safety Departments do not have the adequate training facilities available and must travel out of the County for their training needs. The departments have been working on identifying appropriate land and funding to construct facilities that can accommodate the ongoing training needs of their staff since 2012.

While numerous training facilities are in other areas of the State it means our public servants are not available to respond timely or effectively due to the distances away from Hernando County. It also requires cooperative and sometimes complex scheduling. A suitable facility should be constructed to accommodate continued training requirements as well as provide new fire rescue and law enforcement candidates a proper environment and facilities to learn and hone their skills.

Hernando County now has 60 acres of land earmarked for a public safety training facility.
