Sustainability

Senior loneliness is a serious issue that affects millions of older adults and can lead to depression, cognitive decline, and poor physical health. As people age, their social circles shrink, and opportunities for connection diminish. To combat this, the YMCA is creating the *Active Seniors Summer at the Y*, multi-faceted program, to keep older adults engaged through dynamic recreational and social programs. Increased group/water exercise classes and equipment will promote movement, strength, and mental well-being. New Pickleball offerings, with its low-impact nature and social format, will be especially effective in encouraging regular interaction and physical activity. Twice monthly field trips will provide a change of scenery and shared experiences that foster friendships. This program will do more than fill time—it will build community, boost morale, and improve overall health. By offering a variety of fun, accessible options, we help older adults stay active, connected, healthy and thriving. Addressing senior health and loneliness with intention and creativity strengthens not only individuals, but our communities as a whole.


The program's sustainability strategy centers around implementing best practices to achieve data-driven goals and leveraging existing networks to identify potential future grantors. Additionally, once the program is up and running, we intend to collaborate with organizations that share a similar mission, apply for additional grants, utilize existing YMCA resources, seek in-kind support, and organize fundraising events.

#### VII. FINANCIAL DOCUMENTATION

# A. Financial Capacity:



The YMCA of the Suncoast demonstrates strong financial stability and a solid capacity to deliver impactful programs and services to the Hernando County community. The organization's 2024 Audited Financial Statements received an Unqualified (or "clean") opinion, underscoring its sound financial practices. With total assets of \$48.8 million and relatively low liabilities of \$2.8 million, the YMCA maintains a healthy net asset position of \$46.1 million.

A substantial portion of the organization's revenue—83%—is generated through program service fees and membership dues, reflecting strong community engagement and support. While grants and contributions are essential to its operations, the YMCA has the flexibility to adapt to year-to-year changes in external funding.

The organization employs a conservative investment approach to safeguard its financial resources for long-term sustainability. Its leadership and financial management teams are highly experienced, with most having over 20 years of service either with this YMCA or within the broader YMCA network. The finance team includes professionals with degrees in accounting, and the Chief Financial Officer has a CPA certificate.

Financial oversight is further strengthened by a volunteer Finance Committee, comprised of members of the Board of Directors and others. This committee meets monthly to review financial performance, monitor variances, and assess operational trends, risks, and opportunities. Across the organization, transparency and consistent communication with both internal and external stakeholders are core values upheld by the entire leadership team.

To attract participants for the Active Seniors Summer at the Y program, we will implement a targeted, multi-channel marketing plan. First, we will utilize our YMCA member database to promote the program directly through emails, flyers, and social media posts. We will host free demo days featuring sample classes and mini field trips to spark interest. Our outreach will extend to local churches and community organizations, as well as partnerships with healthcare providers. Social media campaigns will showcase participant testimonials and highlight the program's benefits. Staff and volunteers will actively promote the program through word-of-mouth during YMCA events. Finally, we will offer guest passes and other incentives to boost enrollment and retention. This integrated approach ensures wide reach while fostering a personal connection with our target audience.
