

**RESOLUTION NO. 2026-\_\_\_\_\_**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF HERNANDO COUNTY, FLORIDA, DECLARING AN END TO THE EMERGENCY DROUGHT CONDITIONS REQUIRING A COUNTYWIDE BURN BAN; REPEALING THE BURN BAN PREVIOUSLY IMPLEMENTED BY RESOLUTION NO. 2026-081 IN ALL UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF HERNANDO COUNTY, FLORIDA; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE FOR REPEAL**

**WHEREAS**, the Board of County Commissioners of Hernando County, Florida (“Board”), adopted Ordinance No. 2025-02, setting forth the procedures to be followed in the event a drought emergency is declared; and

**WHEREAS**, for the past several months, Hernando County (“County”) has experienced a severe rainfall deficit leading to drought-like conditions in the County; and

**WHEREAS**, due to prolonged drought conditions, an extreme shortage of rainfall, and a spike in brushfires throughout the County, and after consulting with several fire departments within the State of Florida, the Fire Chief determined that a drought emergency existed in the unincorporated areas of the County and, pursuant to Ordinance 2025-02, declared a countywide temporary burn ban effective April 14, 2026; and

**WHEREAS**, to prevent brushfires and wildfire, open burning was prohibited except as specifically authorized by the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, Division of Forestry; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board ratified the Fire Chief’s declaration and adopted Resolution No. 2026-081, *nunc pro tunc* to April 14, 2026, implementing a ban on open burning in response to the heightened fire risk, as woodlands and vegetation throughout the County had become highly susceptible to fire hazards; and

**WHEREAS**, in recent weeks, the County has received much needed rainfall, substantially reducing fire hazards; and

**WHEREAS**, the State Division of Forestry and local fire officials have advised that continued enforcement of the burn ban is no longer necessary; and

**WHEREAS**, because conditions have improved, it is appropriate at this time for the Board to repeal the burn ban.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF HERNANDO COUNTY, FLORIDA AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1. Incorporated Whereas Clauses.** The foregoing Whereas clauses are true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein by reference.

**Section 2. Findings.** The Board of County Commissioners of Hernando County, Florida, finds and determines that the emergency drought conditions requiring implementation of a burn ban pursuant to Resolution No. 2026-081 no longer exist, and further finds that repeal of the burn ban is appropriate for the reasons set forth herein, and therefore hereby repeals the burn ban implemented under Resolution No. 2026-081.

**Section 3. Repeal.** This Resolution shall supersede and repeal Resolution No. 2026-081, which implemented a burn ban, in accordance with the provisions set forth herein.

**Section 4. Effective Date.** This Resolution shall take effect at 12:00 a.m., on the \_\_\_\_\_ day of May 2026.
