

RESOLUTION NO. 2026 - _____

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF HERNANDO COUNTY, FLORIDA, PROHIBITING TRUCKS FROM TRAVELING UPON DESIGNATED ROADS IN THE ROYAL HIGHLANDS SUBDIVISION PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 20, ARTICLE IV, SECTION 20-62 OF THE HERNANDO COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES, AND CHAPTER 316, FLORIDA STATUTES; PROVIDING FOR FINDINGS; PROVIDING FOR PLACEMENT OF "NO THRU TRUCKS" SIGNS; PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 316.006(3), *Florida Statutes*, Hernando County has original jurisdiction over all streets and highways located within Hernando County, excluding state roads and excluding streets and highways within municipalities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 316.006(3), *Florida Statutes*, Hernando County may place and maintain traffic control devices, which conform to the specifications of the Florida Department of Transportation, upon all streets and highways under its jurisdiction, as the County deems necessary to regulate, warn or guide traffic; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 316.008(1)(g), *Florida Statutes*, Hernando County may, with respect to streets and highways under its jurisdiction, restrict the use of streets; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 20, Article IV, Section 20-62, *Code of Ordinances*, Hernando County, Florida, the Board of County Commissioners may, by resolution, prohibit trucks from travelling upon designated county streets, roads, highways, or bridges by posting signs indicating that no trucks are allowed on designated portions of a roadway; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 20-62, *Code of Ordinances*, Hernando County, Florida, the Department of Public Works, in collaboration with the Engineering Department, has reported the reasons why truck traffic is detrimental upon the designated streets in the Royal Highlands Subdivision, more specifically at the intersections of Condor Road and Ricebird Avenue; Condor Road and Resort Avenue; Condor Road and Redstart Avenue; Resort Avenue and Cedarwood Avenue; and Redstart Avenue and Canyon Swallow Road, as shown in **Exhibit A, B, and C**; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners find that prohibiting trucks from traveling upon the designated streets in the Royal Highlands Subdivision, as shown in **Exhibits A, B, and C**, is necessary to protect the public's health, safety and welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF HERNANDO COUNTY, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Findings. Pursuant to Section 20-62, *Code of Ordinances*, Hernando County, Florida, and Chapter 316, *Florida Statutes*, the Board of County Commissioners has received the report of the Department of Public Works, in collaboration with the Engineering Department, stating the reasons why truck traffic is detrimental upon the designated streets in the Royal Highlands Subdivision and finds that prohibiting trucks from traveling upon the designated streets within the Royal Highlands Subdivision, is necessary to protect the public's health, safety and welfare.

Section 2. Placement of "No Thru Trucks" Signs. "No Thru Trucks" signs shall be placed upon the designated streets in the Royal Highlands Subdivision, at the intersections of Condor Road and Ricebird Avenue; Condor Road and Resort Avenue; Condor Road and Redstart Avenue; Resort Avenue and Cedarwood Avenue; and Redstart Avenue and Canyon Swallow Road, as shown in **Exhibit A, B, and C.**

Section 3. Enforcement and Penalties. Hernando County may enforce the restrictions adopted herein and impose penalties for violations of these restrictions by any method authorized by local or state law.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
